If you drive through Willard on a weekday morning, you'll probably find a few cars parked out front belonging to a handful of locals that stop in for coffee and the day's news.

Joe and Karen bought what is now known as "Willard Farm & Auto Repair" in March, 1982, along with Karen's brother, Dick St. John. Dick left a year later. After giving up farming and their other odd jobs, Joe and

Karen put everything they had into the business.

A lot of long days and late nights built a reputable business and a reliable source of help when it came to automotive, farm and small-engine repair. Karen helped Joe in the shop as well as managed the bookwork until 1996 when she took another job. She still helped out when needed and did the books every night for the next day.

The time has come for Joe and Karen to retire and hopefully take time to do some things for themselves. On July 13, 2007, Tolaney's sold Willard Farm & Auto to Loren and Lonnie Weaver, two brothers living in the Willard area. Weavers plan to continue operating the shop as it has been in the past.
